TEACHERS & STUDENTS NEED YOUR HELP
LISTED BELOW ARE AREAS OF SERVICE. TRAINING IS PROVIDED:

- TUTOR** Under the direction of the teacher, working one on one with a child or small groups of students helping with reading, math and or spelling skills.
- CLERICAL** Copying papers, grading papers under the direction of a teacher. Completing and coloring games and clerical work for a teacher.
- LIBRARY** Helping children find enjoyable books. Checking books and material in and out under the direction of the librarian.
- SHORT TERM** For volunteers who cannot commit to a special time but who would like to help with short volunteer term projects. Example: Vision and Hearing screening, P. E. Testing, Dolch word screening, resource person and field trip chaperones are needed.
- PUPPETEER** Perform educational curriculum script for students using “Kids on the Block Puppets.” Assist counselors as they help children deal with social problems of today.
- MILLER** Serve as a positive role model and provide tutoring and social support to help empower and motivate students to succeed.
- MENTOR** Work with individual students’ approximately 30 minutes to an hour once or twice a week.
- VISION & SC** Checking Pre-K through 8th grade students vision & hearing at each school. You will be trained to use school vision or hearing testing equipment. Training provided. Short term approximately 1 or 2 mornings. – or afternoons a week from Aug –Oct.
- ART APPR.** Share FUN information with one grade level, training provided. Learn the different classifications of art. Go with students and teachers to the OKC Museum of art. Short duration, Museum trips and FUN!
- SERVICE SHELF** Help teachers in the building by with running copies, using die cuts, and/or coloring, as needed
- WATCHDOG** Available at Skyview & Surrey Hills, these volunteers spend time in their schools to DADS help provide a safe environment & serve as positive male role models.
